

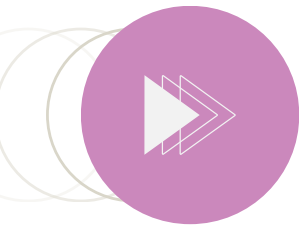

Responding to God's calling, PHG was established in 2011 to provide a safe home, trauma recovery, and holistic growth opportunities for girls who have survived sexual abuse and human trafficking. Project 20/20 is the continuation of this mission and calling.



God's Guidance Over the Past 15 Years

- ✓ Over 150 cases have been served, witnessing how God has continued to bring wounded girls to PHG.◦
- ✓ There are currently 46 active cases, including 18 girls living in the home and 28 post-reintegration community follow-up cases.◦

We have witnessed

- ✓ Girls completing university education, getting married, having children, rebuilding family relationships, and experiencing life transformation.
- ✓ Graduates have returned to serve as teachers, volunteers, and staff, continuing the legacy of love. . . .



The Challenges We Face Today

Needs We See

- Home capacity remains consistently near full.
- We continue to receive 5–7 referrals monthly, with a waiting list of around 10 girls.
- At one point, 6 trafficking survivor referrals in a single month could not be accepted due to lack of bed space.
- Safe residential care options are declining. Today, only about 5 similar residential programs remain in Phnom Penh, many of which are already at or near full capacity.



Limitations of the Current Model

- The rented-property model limits long-term planning and facility investment.
- The current space is insufficient, making it difficult to further improve service quality and therapeutic outcomes.
- Limited residential capacity makes it difficult to respond to growing needs.
- Rising rental costs increase long-term operational pressure.
- Accumulated rental expenses from 2011–2025 reached US\$580,793

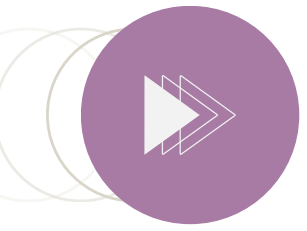
The project was originally planned to begin, but was delayed due to the pandemic and various other factors.

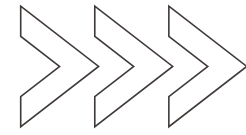

The land is ready, the architectural plans are largely completed, the five-year development plan has been completed, and approximately US\$518,800 has been raised before any major fundraising campaign has officially begun.

The Vision of Project 20/20



Expanding from 18 beds to 50 beds, significantly increasing both service capacity and impact.

The New Home Will Include:

- Dormitories
- Counseling Rooms
- Play Therapy Room
- Classrooms
- Staff Offices
- Social Enterprise
- Vocational Training Space
- Multi-purpose Activity Hall
- Meeting & Training Rooms



Our goal is not simply to add more beds, but to strengthen our overall recovery and development capacity, enabling more girls who have survived sexual abuse and human trafficking to rebuild their lives and move toward a hopeful future.◦

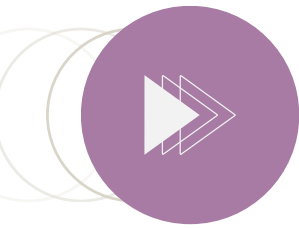




Financial Sustainability Plan

Phased Expansion & Five-Year Operational Budget Forecast

Year	Forecasted Total Cost
2028 - (18 girls)	\$180,000
2029 - (22 girls)	\$200,000
2030 - (30 girls)	\$310,000
2031 - (40 girls)	\$415,000
2032 - (50 girls)	\$495,000



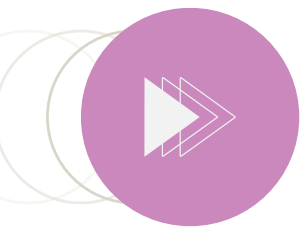
Why Are We More Confident Today Than Five Years Ago?

We See Greater Opportunities:

- Demand for anti-trafficking residential care continues to increase.
- More cross-organizational partnership models are emerging.
- Organizations are proactively exploring collaboration opportunities to help meet residential care needs.
- PHG's 15 years of experience and recovery model have been recognized and affirmed.
- In recent years, the Cambodian government has become more proactive in responding to human trafficking issues and continues to cooperate with PHG at various levels.



We have not included any unsigned partnerships or potential collaborations in our financial projections. Yet these developments allow us to see that God is opening new doors for the future.
